Scripture Reflection by David Heimann, Pastoral Associate

In my childhood, I remember my older brothers occasionally complaining to my mom, "But you let David get away with it!" My mother would respond, "Yes, but I expect more from you. You know better."

I'm sure many of us can remember similar exchanges in our own families. Now, if I'm honest, what I learned from this experience is that I could get away with a lower standard of behavior. It led to a long pattern of scheming in which I knew I could get away with things that I probably shouldn't have. It's a malady of behavior I call Youngest-Child-Syndrome (YCS).

The thing is, as people, we all suffer from YCS to some degree. It's symptoms are at the heart of this Sunday's Gospel reading from Mark. In the Gospel (Mark 10:2-12) Jesus refers to Moses who allowed the Israelites to get away with things. They didn't have to follow the intent and ambitions of the law because the law was too hard. Moses let the people settle for less.

But not Jesus. He didn't fall for the Israelite's collective YCS. He gave his followers a goal, something of which to aspire. He doesn't want us to settle.

I think of this example a great deal when I think of the Church and how the Church teaches us. The Church is known for setting up high standards and expectations even though many in the Church (both its members and the magisterium) don't always live up to the standard set. As a church worker, I often am the vehicle through which those standards are communicated, even though it might sound hypocritical of me to do so given my own sins.

To me, it is a matter of the stance we ought to take as we approach life. Which direction do I want to look when I set my gaze for my moral ambition? Is it toward the highest goal or the lowest common denominator?

Jesus chose the highest goal and I think he's right. If we set our standard too low and let ourselves get away with wherever our basest passions lead us, then we as a Church, as a nation, as a culture, as a city, and as a neighborhood will end up with collective YCS. We won't grow and mature into healthy human beings.

But what is also important is to understand that we can't grow if we don't accept and love ourselves for who we are as we aspire to become more. Jesus is the ultimate teacher because that is how he teaches. He establishes high standards for us to follow but walks with us toward those high standards. Jesus never condemns us or rebukes us just because we can't make it on our own. He too was a child and knows the only way to overcome YCS is one step at a time.



Learn at Home, for Individuals & Families

God Our Father and Creator...

When we think of God, we may think of a Father, Provider, or Creator. As the triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit exist in a beautiful, mysterious relationship. Our relationship to God as creation not only compels us to rely on His love for our very existence, but also calls us to participate in His work as stewards of the earth. In Genesis 1:28, God instructs humanity to "Have responsibility over [...] all the living things that crawl on the earth." Dominion in this sense does not mean domination - we are not to use and abuse the earth purely for our own pleasure and profit. If we are made in the image and likeness of God, we are also made to reflect His mercy, grace, love, and respect for all living things. God places humanity in creation as part of a larger plan, both as members of creation and as trusted guardians.

Ideas to Do At Home:

<u>Watch</u>: Swap your TV shows for a documentary on God's creation. Staff picks: *Virunga, Planet Earth.* <u>Read</u>: Writings of Gerard Manley Hopkins, Jesuit priest and poet. Try *"God's Grandeur"* or *"Pied Beauty."* <u>Do</u>: Put on gloves and take a trash bag out to clean up your neighborhood with friends. You might make a new one!

<u>Pray</u>: Look up the two prayers at the conclusion of Pope Francis's encyclical *"Laudato Si: Care for Our Common Home"* on the internet.
