

### Pastoral Letter by David Heimann, Pastoral Associate



"In the voting booth, it is my deepest values, many of which are incubated in the hearth of my relationship with God that should speak to me." Dear Parish Family,

Netflix is ruing my life. Here is why. Netflix doesn't have commercials. During the next week and half, I find that dangerously appealing. It could allow me to avoid the uncomfortable deluge of commercials from political candidates that are flooding normal broadcast television.

What I've learned about my spiritual life is that when I don't like something, or something makes me uncomfortable, it is usually a place where God is calling me to respond. In the case of politics, my current inner dissonance is actually God trumpeting into my conscience a morning reveille. It is time to wake up. It is time to vote.

Yes, apathy has its appeal. I'm tempted to walk away in disgust with the whole system. I'm tempted to just watch Netflix and forget about it. I could happily forgo a couple news cycles of people yelling at each other over the latest outlandish thing a politician said. But when election day comes, it is a test of my Catholic faith. In the voting booth, it is my deepest values, many of which are incubated in the hearth of my relationship with God that should speak to me.

I don't know how your conscience is telling you to vote and it isn't the role of a pastoral leader to dictate anyone choices. But it is our mutual responsibility to remind each other of our moral obligation. Watch the news. Read up on the candidates. Consult your values. Consult your conscience. Turn off Netflix. Go vote on November 6!

### Scripture Reflection by Deacon Eric Sorensen

Our lives changed on a single February morning, when our son, Steven, went sledding down a treecovered hill and shattered his right femur. The doctor's prognosis was that at his age, the broken leg would not grow at its normal rate.

So, he would need a special platform shoe, but definitely would never be able to run again. With anger we asked how God could of let this happen. Oh God, WHY, Why, why! We asked and we prayed, but our lives would never be the same. I know that we weren't the first to make requests of God, for in the Gospel the blind man cried out, "Son of David, have pity on me." Last week James and John requested, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you."

Jesus replied to the blind man, who wants to see, "Go your way, your faith has saved you." To his Apostles, who wished for glory, he said, "You do not know what you are asking." Had we known what you are for? Matthew's Gospel, 6:8, Jesus says our "Father knows what you need before you ask him," but continue to pray anyway. Why?

St. Augustine explains that God wants us to exercise our desire through prayer, so that we may be able to receive what he is preparing to give us. "His gift is very great indeed, but our capacity is too small and limited to receive it." Letter 130. The blind man recognized his Master's call. He threw off the cloak of his old ways. His faith was deep. So seeing, he followed Jesus, as a new disciple. Perhaps we had thrown off the cloak of our old ways after Steven's accident, as our lives were indeed different.

We began to pray regularly. We focused our desires. And our capacity to love expanded. St. Augustine says, "The deeper our faith, the stronger our hope, the greater our desire, the larger will be our capacity to receive that gift, which is very great indeed." I met Steven's doctor years later and related that Steven had run crosscountry in high school, and had completed a marathon.

He couldn't explain the normal growth in his right leg. But we knew the source of this gift. We had learned how to ask for our desires through prayer. We had allowed our hearts to expand.

We had embraced a deeper faith in Jesus. And what a wondrous difference in our lives, as disciples of Christ.

### October: The Month of the Holy Rosary

Many of us have particular connections to the rosaries in our homes - they once belonged to a deceased grandparent, they were a gift at First Eucharist, or might have been blessed by a special priest, bishop, or even a pope! The beads are made of plastic, wood, stone, or precious jewels and metals. The origins of the rosary are hard to determine. While some point to Saint Bernard and others to Saint Dominic as particular carriers of the tradition, many more are familiar with the appearance of Our Lady of Fatima, and the message of peace she bore to three shepherd children in a world plagued by war and violence. Take time this month to meditate on the prayers and mysteries of the rosary. The time you spend in close conversation with God, Mary, and Jesus, guided by the power of the Holy Spirit, is never time wasted.
