"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (John 1:5) Dear Parish Family,

Scripture Reflection by Deacon Eric Sorensen

Today Jesus is continuing his 'Sermon on the Plain' with further teachings to the crowd. He is explaining to his disciples the astonishing love of God. A love that Jesus is expecting his followers to extend, even to one's enemies. "For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

William Shakespeare wrote a comedy on today's Gospel. He wrestled with this teaching of loving one's enemies, entitled *Measure for Measure*. The play is as poignant for us today, as it was 400 years ago. It is focused on the extension of love to those who have wronged us. Although a comedy, Shakespeare explores the depths of a love that is "merciful, just as your Father is merciful."

Years back, Rita and I took a class at the University of Michigan on Comparative World Religions. In the classroom hung a poster of Jesus' teaching, "Do to others as you would have them do to you;" traditionally known as the **Golden Rule**. The poster emphasized the parallel wisdom in over 30 different religions, mostly non-Christian. A universal standard highlighting an active love, lavishly and unselfishly attentive to others. The *golden way* that we treat others will be the standard for the way we are treated by God.

This is Jesus' teaching on our Father's unconditional love for us. Jesus' expectation for us is to love always. He is imploring us to do whatever is necessary to avoid the poison of hatred or resentment from creeping into our souls. He is asking us to see beyond our neighbors' and our officials' personalities, and seek our Father's love for them. In so doing, we too will love as Jesus does.

As Jesus' disciples, we are asked to be merciful, to stop judging, and to stop condemning. But do not look to Shakespeare to solve this difficulty of forgiving our so-called enemies, those who have wronged us. We are called to a higher standard, as Paul assures us, not by ourselves, but through the power of the risen Lord, whose image we bear.

If we forgive and are generous, we will be forgiven and will receive generously, "a good measure, ...and overflowing." As disciples we are called to forgive, to do good, to be merciful, and to love others, "then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High." We struggle in offering such love, but through the goodness of God, we will exceed in loving others, as we would have them love us.

Learn at Home, for Individuals & Families

The Sacraments

In Living the Sacraments, author Joe Paprocki describes the sacraments as "thin moments," significant opportunities when "we find ourselves encountering and keenly aware of the divine presence." When we celebrate a sacrament, we celebrate in a very tangible way the intangible God - we have a visible reminder of God's love for us. These are not the only moments when we encounter God, but they are moments when we can see and hear God acting directly through the sacramental rites to touch us, individually. Take some time this week to contemplate the sacraments you have received, or the ones you have yet to receive. Can you draw upon those moments now? Can you allow those sacraments to strengthen you, long after you have received them? As Paprocki says, "As Catholics, our guest is not just to receive the sacraments but to live the sacraments."

Annual Catholic Appeal


