

Pastoral Letter by Deacon Mark Purdome



"These days, downtime takes planning." Hard to believe, isn't it, that it is the last Sunday in July. School starts in just a month!

When I was a kid, summer seemed to stretch out endlessly. We called my favorite place "The Woods" (somehow it seems right to capitalize those words), an abandoned tree nursery with plenty of places to race bikes, climb trees, sit in the shade, and play in the creek. We'd spend all day in the woods, making it back home all hot and dirty just in time for dinner. There was plenty of downtime to recharge.

Summer seems much shorter now. Time often seems to be in short supply. Lazy time, adventure time, play time: as an adult, there are higher-priority things that need to be done, and we don't always take time for the downtime we all need. In 2013, Scientific American magazine quoted studies that show that downtime is indispensable to our brains, and that moments of respite are key to keeping our moral compass in working order and maintaining our sense of self.

These days, downtime takes planning. Hopefully, as we continue to cross the summer days off the calendar, we all have an opportunity to plan a mental break, an opportunity for a summer day that recharges your mind and reenergizes your spirit.

Scripture Reflection by Deacon Eric Sorensen

How often have you heard the expression, "Actions speak louder than words?" This was the underlining message from my parents growing up. With a family of five rambunctious children this was a challenging lesson to teach. Yet there was persistence by my parents to teach us right from wrong and to be responsible for our actions. They emphasized that our actions speak the truth as to who we are. And our actions, guided by grace, enables us to enact who we ought to be.

The expression on action is attributed to St Anthony of Lisbon (Padua). "Actions speak louder than words; Let your words teach and your actions speak." This is what Jesus was teaching his disciples by word and example on the way to Jerusalem, to follow his ways. Just as Jesus prays to the Father, so must we persist, as shown by Abraham's petitions for the city of Sodom. Jesus encourages us to act, to "ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you."

This summer we have two rambunctious grandchildren that we

are trying to teach by our own words and examples.

We are polite to others, so they should be polite. We show respect to all whom we meet, so they should be respectful. We apologize, so they should say they are sorry. We forgive others, so they should by forgiving. We pray to our Father, so they should pray. Lord knows that we are asking, seeking and knocking for his grace to guide our grandchildren in his way!

So, who doesn't want "to give good gifts to their children?" From a very early age children learn to mimic what we do, before responding to what we say. Are we confident that our actions speak for us and not against us? Our Father promised to help by giving us "the Holy Spirit to those who ask him." So let us persistently ask and pray that we are guided by the grace of the Holy Spirit. Because with this grace we may act as we ought and not as we do. And there is no greater gift that we can give them than showing the love of God to each of our children and grandchildren. Yes, actions speak louder than words!

Learn at Home, for Individuals & Families Care for God's Creation

As the weather turns warm, we spend more time outside. The north side of Chicago is blessed with beautiful parks, tree-lined streets, and extensive beaches along Lake Michigan. From water sports to little league, visits to our manicured zoo and walks through native plantings, there is something for everyone.

Our beautiful planet is a gift from God, which God puts both under our control and in our hands. (Genesis 1:28). We have dominion over the earth, but how often does that dominion lead to domination? When humanity focuses on productivity and profit, the earth suffers. The land is scarred, the seas are polluted, and the air we breathe is heavy with the fumes of industry.

To ensure that there really is "something for everyone," it is one of the pillars of Catholic Social Teaching that we practice Care for God's Creation. Fair distribution and preservation of natural resources ensures that not only is there enough to go around, but that we are able to pass on God's gift to the next generation. Our care for the planet is a demonstration of compassion and care for one another. "Everything is connected. Concern for the environment thus needs to be joined to a sincere love for our fellow human beings and an unwavering commitment to resolving the problems of society." (*Laudato Si*, 91).
