

### Scripture Reflection by David Heimann, Pastoral Associate

In today's Gospel, it seems that the key to exalting yourself is to pretend to be humble, to fight for the lowest seat, and then preen your feathers when you are asked to take your "rightful" place. Somehow, I think that's not the message that we're supposed to take home today. Eleonore Stump, a professor of philosophy at Saint Louis University, writes that racing your friends to be "humble" because you think there is a reward is just pride hiding as humility. So what might this parable mean?

True humility (as defined by Eleanor) is simply recognizing that every good in yourself is a gift from God and is meant to be given back to the Lord by being shared with others. We know that we are filled with good gifts that have been given to us by God and it is proper that we use those gifts. But the key element is that the gifts we receive are *given back to the Lord by being shared with others.* 

Jesus isn't suggesting that we put on a mask of humility in order that we ultimately triumph, pretending that we are the least in order to score the best place in the Kingdom of Heaven. In this case, "faking it" doesn't do the trick, because there's no way to fake sharing your gifts with others. Sure, there are people who try (you've probably seen their humble-brag posts on social media), but you can quickly tell that they are really just promoting themselves.

Although our customs for a dinner party are different from those of the firstcentury, Jesus' suggestion to the host that he invite those who couldn't pay him back is an attempt to teach this kind of humility. In the time of Jesus, dinner invitations were based on social rank you tended to go to parties with people of the same social class. Repayment of the host with a like invitation in the future was expected. So only someone who was truly humble, who truly interested in sharing their gifts with others, would be willing to invite the outcasts, the lame, and the lower social classes to their party. This is how God throws a banquet. Everyone is invited, without regard for our ability to repay or our social class.

So rather than a humble-brag on social media, our goal is to seek true humility, sharing our gifts with others, thankful that all are invited to the banquet of the Lord.

### The Dignity of Work

This month we celebrate Labor Day. This holiday emerged at the end of the 19th century, during the Second Industrial Revolution, when large factories employed thousands of workers who operated in unsafe conditions and without fair pay. Labor Day provided an opportunity to celebrate the dignity of workers, which also happens to be a Catholic Social Teaching!

These days, we talk less about "labor" and more about "the state of the economy." News agencies report incessantly on the stock market and trade wars. What happens when we do this? We stop seeing people and start seeing statistics, margins, profits.

The word "economic" comes from the Greek word *oikonomia,* meaning "household management." What happens if we consider modern economics less of a numbers game and more as the functioning of a well organized family unit? In an ideal family, each member helps as best they can with the gifts they have. All contributions are appreciated and valued.

Just as it is easy to feel underappreciated by family members, imagine how it might feel to be undervalued by an entire community? For workers who are paid less than minimum wage, who work multiple jobs without benefits, who face discrimination because of creed, color, or gender... this is a daily reality. Upholding the dignity of work means seeing everyone around us as important and valued. How can you practice dignity for work at home?

**Keep an eye out** for any "unsung heroes" in your life, whose you encounter on your commute or at work. Make them feel appreciated with a genuine thank you. **Educate yourself.** Search "CST 101: Dignity of Work" for a video that explains more about this teaching. awareness.

**Set a limit.** An 8 hour work day was established for a reason! Don't abuse the dignity of work by over-doing it. Set time aside to rest, reflect, and give thanks to God.
