Pastoral Letter by Deacon Mark Purdome



"One Newman scholar writes that he is a great example and inspiration for people who struggle," "Next weekend, Pope Francis will canonize five new saints, among them Blessed Cardinal John Henry Newman. That name may sound vaguely familiar, because many of us encountered "Newman Centers" while we were in college. In his writings, Cardinal Newman encouraged the development of societies to provide spiritual support for Catholic students at secular Universities, so many Catholic campus centers are named for him.

Newman was from London and spent the first half of his life as an Anglican. But in 1845, after research and prayer, he became Catholic and was ordained a priest two years later. He was a popular preacher and writer, wanting not only to touch people's intellect, but also their hearts.

And he was a complex person. One Newman scholar writes that he is a great example and inspiration for people who struggle, whose lives are a bit complicated or messy at times, because his life demonstrated that it is really about how we handled the mess than whether we had things perfect all the while. Another writer described Newman as having "compassion for the perplexed."

That's a great image for many of our college students who are now back at their studies. This week, let's keep all college students, and all those who are dealing with the messiness of life, in our prayers as we ask John Henry Newman to intercede for us.

Scripture Reflection by Deacon Eric Sorensen

At our school masses on Wednesday the dignity of all people from mornings the children often sing the song, Go Make a Difference by Steve Angrisano, as we go forth from mass. This song echoes in my ears as we all witness 16 year old Greta Thunberg going forth to make a difference on climate change. You could hear the anger and frustration of the Prophet Habakkuk, as she addressed the UN council last week. "I cry for help but you do not listen! I cry out to you, 'Violence!' but you do not intervene. Why do you let me see ruin; why must I look at misery?" Yet, we are seeing what a *mustard seed* of conviction can do, as she galvanizes the youth of the world to go make a difference in the world.

Greta's inspiration is a testimony for us that have faith. We too are all called by Jesus to go forth and make a difference, just as the first apostle did. We can choose to offer our seed of faith to care for those who are currently suffering from hurricanes, flooding, tornadoes and drought. We can choose to stand up and joined the efforts to make a change in our global warming. We can choose to petition our leaders to put an end to gun violence. We can choose to enforce the awareness of

conception to death. We can and must be people that Jesus calls as his disciples in this world.

Greta, of course, is scoffed at and chastised by world leaders, but it does not deter her. So it is with our discipleship, as we "bear our share of the hardship for the gospel, but with the strength that comes from God." St Paul reminds us, that "God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, ...ashamed of our testimony to our Lord. ...But rather has given us power and love and self-control." A power that moves trees, moves mountains, that bends leaders to serve their people.

Our faith has empowered us to accomplish extraordinary change. God assures us, "the vision still has its time, presses on to fulfillment, and will not disappoint." This vision is a world that cares, shares and loves each other, which is fulfilled in our calling to be Jesus' disciples to those who are venerable. Because of our faith we have confidence, just like Greta, and it will not disappoint! Let us go forth for our children and make that faithful difference in the world.

Life and Dignity of the Human Person

Visit the website of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, and you will quickly see that October is Respect Life month. The phrase "from conception to natural death" may be a familiar one to you, and while moral issues surrounding birth and death are important to address, we sometimes make the mistake of neglecting the "to" of that phrase. What happens in the space between our beginning and end, when we are faced with the decisions of how we choose to *live* our lives?

Recognizing the value of life and the dignity of each person we meet is the foundational principle for all Catholic social teaching. Care for the environment, our responsibilities, fair access to jobs, family and community, working for equality, and the inclusion of poor and marginalized people... all of these concepts flow from the basic idea that human life is precious.

What this means for us is that we hold as precious each and every life God creates: A sister living with disabilities. A co-worker diagnosed with a terminal illness. A teenager addicted to drugs or alcohol. Our neighbors. Strangers. Each person is holy and valuable beyond measure, and should be celebrated as such. We are also more powerful than we know, because we can lift up in thanksgiving and praise each life we encounter if we choose to see others as God sees us. So during October...

Be good to others when you them being excluded. Life them up with words of life. Start with "hello." A lot of good conversations and relationships begin that way.

Be kind to yourself when you get overwhelmed. Remind yourself of your goodness and worth. You are essential to God's plan - you have a purpose.

Give thanks to God for the gift of your life, the life of your family, and for all God's children of all ages.

Religious Education (RE) classes are in session!.


