# Pastoral Update

Dear Parish Family,

This past year we’ve been hearing from Luke’s gospel at Mass. If it seemed as if Jesus has talked a lot about money, you are correct. Many people would be surprised to learn that Jesus talked more about money than any other moral issue, and Luke’s gospel contains more sayings about the right use of money than any of the other gospels.

Jesus’ concern with money and wealth is centered on *right relationships*. Money on its own is neither good or evil. It’s how we use it that’s the key. It can be used to care for our families, receive life-saving remedies, support those who are homeless and hungry, and even keep a parish like Saint Andrew up and running.

As a pastor, I understand that parishioners don’t always want to hear about monetary issues from the pulpit. With all the stresses in life, wouldn’t it be nice to just escape to church for Sunday worship and not be reminded about money? But without assessing the right relationship for the use of our personal resources, we can’t collectively make contributions to our parish community so that there will be a church in which to worship. In addition, as parishioners you have the right to know that your sacrificial financial offerings are being used well. That’s why it is important that we

have this conversation on an annual basis, if not more often. We need to discuss our personal and collective stewardship of the gifts God has given us.

To support this conversation, please find presented in this week’s bulletin our parish’s Annual Update. It is our parish’s stewardship account of the resources that you have entrusted to the community and the purposes which those resources have supported. Embedded in this update is a summary of our financial report from fiscal year 2019 which ended on June 30, 2019. I hope that you’ll discover both a sense of satisfaction for the good work that your contribution has made and that you will be inspired to continue to support Saint Andrew’s mission in the year to come.

This Annual Update is also delivered to you at the start of our annual *Season of Stewardship* in which we ask all parishioners to take account of the gifts that you have been given by God. Just as we have taken time to review the previous year, we ask you to do the same.

During Masses this weekend, we will hand out the *Stewardship Appeal Brochure* and a *Commitment Card*. This brochure will help you to take a personal account of your gifts of **Time, Talent, and Treasure**. Just as Jesus repeatedly advocated for the gift of money to be allocated for the right relationship between people, you are called to determine what is the right relationship for the use of your gifts, especially in light of the many needs that you are facing, including the need to have a vibrant parish.



When you have completed your assessment, we also ask you to complete the Commitment Card provided. When you return the completed card, it will be a public sign that you intend to make your best effort for the stewardship of Saint Andrew parish in the year to come.

Even if you have completed these materials for our *Season of Stewardship* in the past, we are asking that you complete this process again. Every year, your needs change and the same is true of Saint Andrew. We are experiencing an increased need for ministers to serve at our liturgies. We have many openings in our parish commissions that need filling. We need to rotate volunteers who assist with our programs and events to help avoid burnout. And financially, we anticipate that our increase in expenses for the year ahead will require a 4.7% increase in income (*explained on page 9*).

None of these needs can be fulfilled by simply maintaining last year's benchmarks. We need everyone to assess where they can make additional contributions to help advance the mission of Saint Andrew.

Next week, we will seal our commitment by returning these commitment cards at Mass. I hope you will join me in the joyful commitment to be stewards of this wonderful parish community.

Saint Andrew gathers together people from all over the country who have made Chicago their home. Some who have lived in the neighborhood or in Chicago their whole life, but many who have found a new home from far away.

At the heart of our gathering is our Sunday worship at Mass. This is where our community is most fully realized and present. When we avail ourselves to the presence of God in each other, we are transformed just as the gifts of bread and wine that we offer to God are transformed.

We find this transformation in other ways too. The social gatherings of the parish include parties like our Fall Fling and our Lenten Fish Fry and our annual 5K race. Our youth group meets twice a month and young adults in their 20s and 30s can be found gathering in the Social Hall after the 5:30pm Sunday Mass most weeks of the year. The gymnasium is used every day of the week for athletic groups and social events. This past year, we even brought back the ever classic Skate Night! (*seen below*)

Saint Andrew provides the time and space for both Boy and Girl Scouts to meet and foster friendships that will last a life time as well rehearsal space for Irish Dancing, young artists in theatre, and local community groups.


# Learn...

Our core value made possible through your support.

Saint Andrew Parish's largest and most important ministry is the accompaniment of children and adults to grow as disciples of Jesus Christ. Offering opportunities to learn more about the Catholic faith and God's overwhelming love for us are made possible through the support of our parishioners.

Saint Andrew School serves children of our parishioners and other parents who want their child to have a strong Catholic primary education. While helping children grow academically and achieving high benchmarks across the board, Saint Andrew School also nurtures the heart, helping students know who they are as children of God. Serving students from ages 2 ½ through 8th grade, the school currently has a robust enrollment of 488 students from 306 families.

Saint Andrew Religious Education also accompanies students who attend public and private schools in their religious education through our Family Catechesis program. 150 students meet with volunteer catechists and complete at-home assignments with parents to cover the same religious curriculum offered through our parish school. Parents also learn in the process by attending six faith formation sessions every year to support them as they teach their children the faith.

For adults, Saint Andrew has had growing attendance at its primary faith formation experiences for adults including our Advent Speaker Series and the Parish Mission (in Lent or Easter). Parents of newborn children are part of our baptismal preparation classes held once a month and couples meet with our clergy to prepare for the Sacrament of Marriage.

Our newest faith formation program for adults is called REBOOT: UPDATE YOUR SPIRITUALITY. It is a six-week course offered three times a year which helps adults integrate their experience and knowledge as adults into a more mature faith.

We look forward to the year ahead in which this core value, the gift of learning, will continue to be a source of life and energy to our parishioners. Your support of Saint Andrew makes it possible.

# Love... Our core value made possible through your support.

At Saint Andrew, we hear the call of the Gospel to love one another in many different contexts. Through outreach into the community, service to victims of poverty, and support for social concerns, we put the call to love one another into action to hasten the coming of the kingdom of God.

We don't have to go very far to see places in our community that have been touched by our outreach. Parish ministers carry the love of the parish when they visit the homebound, prepare meals for those in need, bring Communion to the sick, and conduct prayer services at area nursing homes. In 2020, we plan to extend that outreach with visits to Artis on Ashland, a new nursing facility in our neighborhood.

Our parishioners also support area agencies with our volunteer efforts. Our youth preparing for Confirmation participate in a variety of charitable projects, including the mobile food pantry at the *Mission of Our Lady of Angels* and at *Feed My Starving Children*.

Each month, volunteers help sort food and serve the poor at the Greater Chicago Food Depository and local food pantries and soup kitchens. For the holidays, we'll provide pies to food pantries through Pies for a Purpose and warm clothing to children in Uptown through our Giving Tree.

Finally, our financial support provides much-needed funding to both local and distant needs. Our long-standing support for St. Charles Lwanga parish in Uganda, the new-for-2019 Souper Bowl to support local soup kitchens, the baby bottle collection to support women in a crisis pregnancy, and many food drives and special collections give us opportunities to support partners that reach out locally, regionally, nationally, and internationally to share our love.

We often think of the word "charity" as being a synonym for benevolence, the act of giving. But a more general definition is that charity is love: love for God and love for our neighbor. Through your efforts, Saint Andrew Parish demonstrates the virtue of charity and God's love for us in the many ways we reach out to the world.




## Maintaining Our Campus...

In recent years, the net ordinary income from the school has been reinvested in capital improvements. Together with funds raised through our annual Fund-A-Need we have been able to make significant improvements to our campus. This past year we were able to replace the windows in the auditorium and chapel, as well as complete repairs on the school roof and the gym chimney. Even though the final numbers for the modernization of the gymnasium are part of fiscal year 2020 (*not included in this report*) the work completed in the gymnasium has a very positive effect on our campus. \*The loss reflected to the Church in **Net Parish Income** fiscal year 2019 reflects projects completed in 2019 in which the income for the projects were received in 2018. So while the parish income (*independent of the school income*) shows a loss of \$77,134, the relationship of ordinary income to ordinary expenses demonstrates a small profit of \$51,761 in 2019.

# Financial Highlights

## Parish Highlights:

Sunday collections at Saint Andrew increased 7% last year meeting our goal. This is a testament to the commitment of Saint Andrew parishioners. Nationally, the trend in most parishes was a decrease in Sunday collections. While this is definitely good news, there are new growth concerns in the year ahead for which we will need to ask additional support.

This year's anticipated increase in expenses will require a modest increase of 4.7% in income, mostly due to the addition of a new staff member (Fr. Silvanus Kidaha) and the automatic 3% cost of living increase for all staff salaries as stipulated by the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Looking forward, the parish is still in need of an additional staff member, a Director of Music/Liturgy to enhance our Sunday liturgies. To reach this goal, we need to increase Sunday attendance at Mass and to increase parishioner financial offering. For those who are able to do so, we ask for increased giving to our Sunday collections, especially through participation in electronic giving.

## School Highlights:

Saint Andrew School continues to be fiscally sound generating its income through student tuition. Consistently for several years, the school has been able to make significant contributions to the physical maintenance of the buildings from within its operating expenses. The school maintains a strong tuition reduction program for parish families who are struggling financially. We seek to promote the opportunity for a Catholic education for any family who seeks to have one.

## Capital Campaign Highlights:

While simultaneously fulfilling the obligations of our operating expenses for several years, Saint Andrew Parish is now in year three of a five year campaign to enrich, expand, and grow our campus. We have completed the lighting repairs in the Church, the upkeep on our Stained Glass Windows, and made our contributions to the To Teach Who Christ Is Campaign. Now we are waiting to start the building process for the expansion to our school. Per rules of the Archdiocese, to do this we will need 80% of the cost of construction in our campaign fund. We currently have \$772,716 in our campaign fund and are awaiting cost analysis of the expansion project.

## Fundraisings Highlights:

Saint Andrew is able to meet its operating expenses through a combination of Sunday offertory collections and fundraising. While Sunday Offerings increased by 7%, the fundraising totals increased only slightly by \$1,500. *Total net fundraising in 2019 was \$200,117 and total net fundraising in 2018 was \$198,605.*
