Scripture Reflection by Deacon Eric Sorensen

At this time, at the end of the Liturgical year, we gather to celebrate the Mass of Jesus as King of the Universe. A truth which is beyond our world, our comprehension, yet sustains our hope. As revealed in our scripture readings, we hear of a King who humbly enters into his Kingdom, especially when we feel that our personal universe is threatened.

During another time, 1929-1939, the nation was suffering from the crisis of the Great Depression and the Dust Bowl. A time in which peoples' universes were in turmoil. It seems that these same scripture readings sustained the hopes of St Andrew parishioners, as witnessed in their dedication of their newly expanded Church on October 23,1932. A dedication to a King that always accompanies his people.

We hear from the Book of Samuel of a King that provides comfort by shepherding his people. Thus, their stained glass window depicting the Good Shepherd. From St Paul to the Colossians, we hear of "the Kingdom of his beloved Son," our King. Thus, their stain glass window depicting Jesus as King, totally committed to caring for his people. Finally, in the Gospel of Luke we hear of the sacrificial love of our King, Jesus.

Thus, their beautiful marble relief of Jesus, the King of the Jews, upon the cross.

As we look at these magnificent works of art, we can see the revelation of the scriptures today. Still these artworks speak so eloquently of the tremendous sacrifices they endured during the 30's, and their impressive witness to their faith in Jesus, as King of the Universe. A King that provided sustenance for them then and hope for generations to come.

Perhaps we too feel the inspiration of these scripture at a time when our universes swirl; that is, an inspiration to finish St Andrew's tribute to the King of the Universe. An altar, not made of wood, but firmly of stone, upon which our King infallibly descends during every mass we celebrate. So, let our sacrifices be a witness to our faith in a King who so humbly wishes to sustain us with body and blood. Sacrifices offered up by contributing to www.standrew.org/altar (Give Central). Indeed, Jesus is the King of Glory, the King of our universes and the Universe, and our hope for generations to come.

The Catholic social teaching of Family, Community and Participation fits well in the months of November and December. In the United States, we spend time preparing for and celebrating holidays which bring our families together from miles away. In addition, this is the time of year many communities are called to active participation in exercising their right to nominate and vote for representatives in government. We vote for leaders who will make wise decisions for our communities, who display compassion and right judgement when it comes to making laws. We recognize that some groups are excluded from this exercise - the poor and vulnerable, the incarcerated, immigrants and refugees. Standing up for the rights of those who do not have a voice is one way we form a society that more perfectly realizes the kingdom of God.

The Giving Tree

Season's Greetings!

Saint Andrew families have helped over 550 students ranging from Pre-K – 8th grade stay warm over the cold, winter, Chicago months. Let's do our part again this year and help those who have less than this holiday season.

As a reminder, the Giving Trees are up and stocked with ornaments and are located in the back of the Church, in the school lobby, inside the Transitions and JK classrooms and outside Pre-K. We will also have volunteers handing out ornaments several days a week at drop off and pick up starting **Monday**, **November 25**th – **Wednesday**, **December 11**th with our "**MOBILE GIVING TREE**". That is when Saint Andrew families will be able to select these ornaments off the trees and begin their holiday shopping for these very deserving children.

As a reminder, here's how it will work:

Each child/student from St. Mary of the Lake and St. Thomas of Canterbury is going to receive a gift from a Saint Andrew family (families can take more than one child if they choose) equaling **no more** than \$25.00. This gift will include two (2) **NEW** items from a pair of gloves/mittens, socks, a winter hat or scarf. Please refrain from purchasing toys, coats, candy, etc. 90% of these students are immigrant families and are often taken aback by how cold Chicago winters are. How thankful these children will be to have two brand new gifts this Christmas! Once your shopping is complete, please return the two (2) **NEW** items **AND** the ornament in a zip lock bag to either the school or the rectory by **THURSDAY**, **DE-CEMBER 14th**. Please DO NOT leave any items under the tree in the Church. Thank you for all your support!
