Pastoral Letter by Deacon Eric Sorensen

Scripture Reflection by David Heimann, Pastoral Associate

I only personally know one person who was alive in Germany during the Second World War. His name is Volker. He is a gentleman who became good friends with my father and subsequently treated me very graciously when I was visiting him and his wife Heidi in Germany.

A lawyer and man of great intelligence, Volker and I have always had very enlivening conversations that helped shape my adult mind. One of the deep impressions Volker gave me during one of our more esoteric conversations was the notion that thriving commerce was the best mechanism for world peace. His theory was that businesses and multi -national corporations have accomplished something in Europe that Christendom had failed to do for centuries. It helped to cease the relentless onslaught of war.

Volker would argue that the same scenario would apply to the world sooner or later if we would only let companies flourish. His logic of commerce-centered politics suggested that stake-holders dislike war because it disrupted business and trading partners. Worst of all, war could result in your office building and manufacturing plant to be bombed. No one want that.

I always think of his insight whenever we come to this time of our Liturgical Year. Once every three years we read the prophecy from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah which states, "They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again." IS 2:4.

It is an extraordinary vision that has the potential to capture our imagination. The question to us as Christians is, "Where do we place our trust?" Is it in a prophecy that foretold the coming of Christ? Is it a new "Christmas" that we are waiting for? Or do we cede to the notion that is something more secular, a profitcentered economic system that will bring us a more peaceful world?

Or is there a third option? Do we really need to divide the world so coldly? Can we entertain the idea that God is in the development of economies? Can we entertain the thought that It is God's guiding hand which has inspired us to create businesses that flourish?

If we can, then I think our daily work has a divine purpose. The work we do, even if it is just running a honest business domestically, can hasten the coming of the Kingdom of God. It is an ingredient into a world in which one nation shall not rise against another, nor shall they train for war again. Or put another way, our daily work has a potentiality not different than a piece of steel. It can be forged to do harm, like a sword, or it can be forged to do good, like a plowshare. The decision is blessedly up to us.

Celebrating Advent Together

Ask a typical first grader about the liturgical year, and you will likely hear about Christmas, Easter, and Ordinary (or "just the regular") time. There is usually some confusion about the difference between Advent and Lent. What is very clear to these young people is that both are a period of intense waiting... particularly when it comes to Christmas.

Lighting each candle of a family's advent wreath indicates that the weeks are ticking by. Advent calendars are all over grocery stores, containing scripture passages or small treats, giving us a little foretaste of the sweetness of Christmas.

Significantly, Advent is a season of Hope. The coming of Jesus in Advent is bound up with the reason for his birth - to be Savior of the World. The coming is threefold: We await Jesus's coming in the Nativity, live in joyful expectation of his Second Coming at the end of time, as well as rejoice in his presence in our midst as risen Lord.

This Advent, allow yourself to live in the reason for THIS season.
