# Pastoral Letter

This weekend we celebrate *Super School Sunday*; no, not Super Bowl Sunday. It kicks off our week, recognizing the value of a Catholic School education at St Andrew School. 

## Scripture Reflection by Deacon Mark Purdome

What does it mean to be called by God? In today’s Gospel, we hear Matthew’s version of the calling of Simon Peter, our own patron Saint Andrew, James, and John to be disciples. Just as we see with the first disciples being called to ministry, we often equate a call from God to be related to service in the church, but it is so much more, because we all are called.

But called to what? We may say that we’re called to a profession, to a vocation like marriage, or to use our talents in a particular way. From a biblical perspective, our calling is not a personal choice, but an invitation that begins with God to become our most authentic selves, and in the process to move along the path of holiness. This implies that our calling isn’t simply something that we’re good at, or a skill that we’ve accomplished, but something much more vast: it touches our soul, and it fills our longing to know who we truly are and why we exist.

As we see in today’s Gospel, a call from God can also be completely unexpected and without warning. It can move us in directions that we never expected; it can startle us and fill us with anxiety; it changes our

lives and the way that we look at the world.

Yet, in all of this, we have an innate knowledge that the call “feels right” because it moves us closer to God, and when we move closer to God, we become more authentic. C. S. Lewis, the author of the Narnia tales, put it this way: “The more we get what we now call ‘ourselves’ out of the way and let God take us over, the more truly ourselves we become. ... God invented—as an author invents characters in a novel—all the different people that you and I were intended to be. In that sense our real selves are all waiting for us in God.”  
*Mere Christianity*

This is a bit of a paradox for our usual way of thinking, because we often think if we follow someone or something too closely, we will lose our own identity. But that isn’t how it works with our calling. Our identity is found in God, so following our call is ultimately the path to knowing ourselves at the deepest level. It is a lifelong process of transformation to become who you were intended to be.

# Learn at Home, for Individuals & Families

## Solidarity

Hyper-connected. Polarized. These two words give us a fair snapshot of our modern society. In one respect, we have never been so in touch with what is happening around the globe - through social media, news outlets, film and radio, we see and hear about events that take place half a world away, almost in real time. Conversely, we constantly find ourselves choosing sides, standing at odds with one another. Communities are sharply divided, with little room to negotiate or compromise. We see this happening in our families, in our government - and yes, even in our church. What should be our reaction to this dichotomy?

Solidarity is a core principle of Catholic Social Teaching. Because we are all created by God, we are all intimately connected to one another. God loves us as adopted children, and we are to do the same; we are to love each other as sisters and brothers.

St. Paul tells us that we are many parts of one body. “If [one] part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy.” (1Cor. 12:26) Jesus gives us clear directions that we are to clothe the naked, feed the hungry, and visit the imprisoned (Mt 25:31-46). This is not a distant form of charity - it is highly personal, messy, unpredictable, and sometimes uncomfortable. God wants us to be involved in each other’s lives, concerned and caring for one another. It takes closeness. It takes solidarity.

When we step outside ourselves and really engage in practicing solidarity, we are not uncomfortable... we find our hearts expanding, because we are made for this kind of love.




