

# Learn at Home, for Individuals & Families

### The Paschal Candle

If you ever had the opportunity to attend the Easter Vigil mass, you witnessed one of the most spectacular liturgical celebrations of the Catholic church. It begins with the lighting of a fire outside, symbolizing the new life given to us in the Resurrection. The priest lights the Paschal Candle, and carries it into a dark church as Christ overcomes death and disspells the night.

Let's take a closer look at that Paschal Candle. It is made of pure beeswax, symbolizing the sinless nature of Christ. The wick represents Christ's humanity, while the flame is his divine nature body and soul, God made Man.

The priest inserts five star shaped spikes into the candle, which each hold a grain of incense. The number five represents the five wounds of Christ, in his hands, feet, and side, while the incense reminds us of the aromatic spices used to prepare his body for the tomb. Additionally, you will see the Greek letters Alpha and Omega, as Jesus is both the beginning and the end. The year is inscribed on our Paschal Candle, which is a sign of our continuing participation in this universal celebration.

We'll mention one more detail: After the procession into the church, the Exsultet is sung. It is the Easter Proclamation, and sets the story of Easter in the context of salvation history, praising God and making a solemn offering of our candle. A particular phrase may bring you joy and comfort this year, as we celebrate Easter in different places, united by the light of Christ...

But now we know the praises of this pillar, which glowing fire ignites for God's honor, a fire into many flames divided, yet never dimmed by sharing of its light.
